PLAYWRIGHTS' NOTES

Choosing 'Robin Hood' for this year's East Van Panto story was a no-brainer. **"Steal from the rich to give to the poor"**—sounds pretty timely! In the last five years, 78% more Canadians are using food banks, while Loblaw CEO Galen Westen's salary rose 55% to 8.4 million dollars per year!

But maybe if you go to No Frills—wait... how about Superstore...wait... how about...

Robin Hood starts to show up in myth and literature with the creation of the "enclosures" as part of the feudal system in what's now the UK. Once upon a time, you could be poor, but there was at least access to "the commons"—lands used to hunt, fish, and gather food. But, by privatizing land around these commons to limit access, and spreading disinformation that the forests were dangerous—full of 'outlaws' perhaps—the only way to get food was from the feudal lord. In fact that's where the word "generosity" comes from—the kindness of the lord to give food back to the people who farmed it.

How nice of them.

The rich always need the poor, but if you convince the poor they need the rich...

Of all the things inherited from the British that still live on in Canada, this idea seems to be one so deeply ingrained that it's hard to imagine something else. But there has always been another way. Let's see what's possible if, together, we tell a new story.

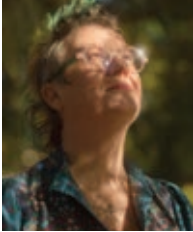
**ANITA ROCHON**

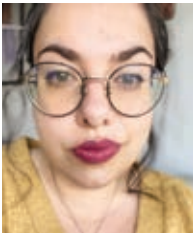


AMANDA TESTINI

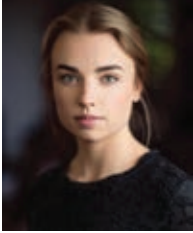


JAE GONZALES

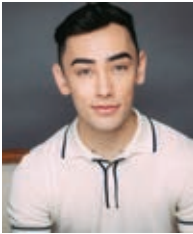


HAYLEY SULLIVAN

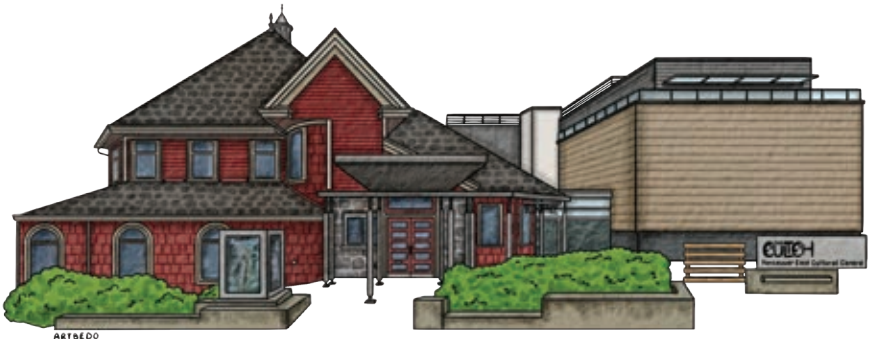

Q&A WITH MINDY PARFITT, DIRECTOR OF *DANCE NATION*

Your company, The Search Party, is known for its hard-hitting productions of some of the most exciting contemporary plays. What drew you to *Dance Nation*?

It's a very compelling story; it's funny but also heartfelt. There's this beautiful juxtaposition between these big glorious moments of dance and these intimate exchanges between characters. I also really love the discussion it is having around success and the tension that exists between individual ambition and the collective endeavor.

What can we expect from the casting?

Dance Nation is a big ensemble piece. It follows a pre-teen dance troupe as they fight their way to nationals. Barron requires that the cast not be teenagers, but rather actors of a variety of ages and dancing capabilities. So we have actors in their early twenties to mid-sixties with a wide range of dancing training who are coming together to tell this story. We had a tremendous response to our casting call—people are really excited to have this play in our city. We've been able to cast this incredible group of actors that I feel very inspired and excited to work with. Matching them with the design team that has been assembled—it's an adventure I can't wait to go on.

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
